- 5. **New Year's Eve Party:** Have your students help you plan and host a New Year's Eve party. They can decorate the classroom, make food


and drinks, and play games.

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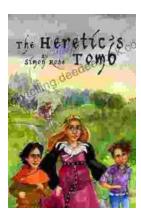
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
