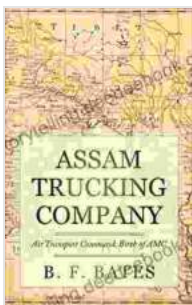


Air Transport Command: The Birth of the United States Air Mobility Command

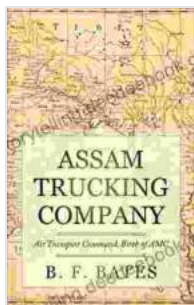
