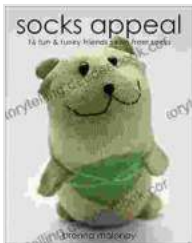

Use a yellow sock for the body and add felt eyes, a beak, and a webbed feet. Don't forget the cute little tail!



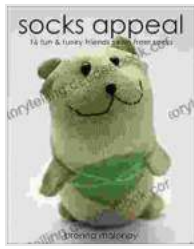
16. Roaring Lion:

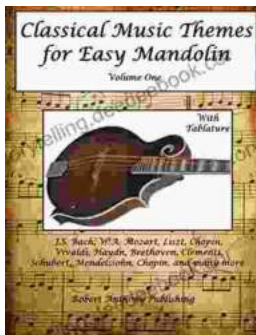
