- 2. If you make a mistake, don't panic. Simply undo the last few stitches and try again.
- 3. Be patient. Crocheting lies can take time, but the results are worth it.

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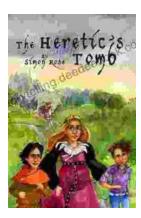
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
